What questions can you ask to make sure you are getting reliable and accurate health information on the Internet?

Who sponsored the website?

Are they an objective, reliable source of medication information? Are they trying to sell me something? Can I tell the difference between ads and drug information?

Does the website give me all the information I need?

Can I find the brand name, generic name, a photo of the medicine, how it should be taken, why it is prescribed, ingredients, problems when it is combined with certain other drugs, and possible undesirable effects?

When was the website last updated?

Has it been reviewed in the last year?

Can I contact someone to ask a question?

Is there a phone number, e-mail address, or other contact information?

Does my doctor agree with this information?

Check this information with your health care provider to make sure it applies to you.

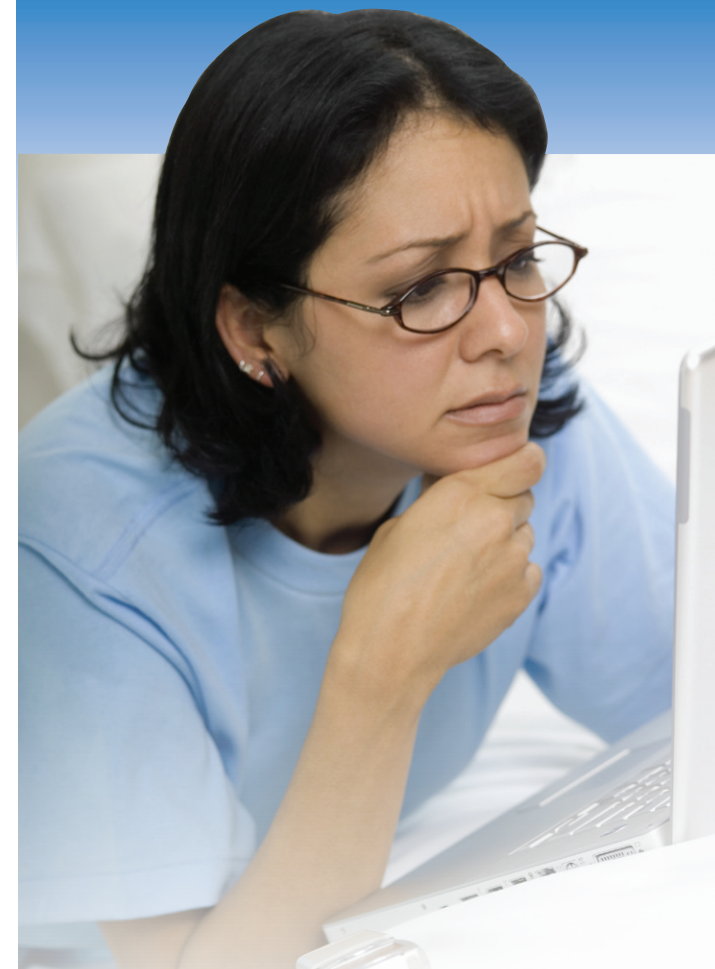
